| SANACORO2T | Critical Survey of Sanskrit Literature | This Course is devided into 5 Sections. | ANACORO6T | Poetics and literary criticism | The study of sāhityaśāstra (Sanskrit Poetics) embraces all poetic arts and includes concepts like alankāra, rasa, rīti, vakrokti, dhvani, aucitya etc. The entire domain of Sanskrit poetics has flourished with the topics such as definition of poetry and divisions, functions of word and meaning, theory of rasa and alamkāra (figures of speech) and chandas (metre), etc. This develops capacity for creative writing and literary appreciation. |
| ANACORO7T | Indian Social Institutions and Polity | This Course is devided into 4 Sections. Social institutions and Indian Polity have been highlighted in Dharma-sastra literature The aim of this course is to make the students acquainted with various aspects of social institutions and Indian polity as propounded in the ancient Sanskrit texts such as Samhitas, Mahabilalata physical Kautilya's Arthasastra and other works known as Nitsanage for Vakshineswar.
